



European Partnership on Animal Health & Welfare (EUP AH&W)



- 90 partners:
 - 56 Research Performing Organizations (RPO)
 - 30 Funding Organizations (FO)
 - Some other entities: EFSA, EMA, Authorities
- From 24 EU and non-EU countries
- Duration 7 years (+3)
- Total budget: 360 M€ estimated over 7 years
- Coordinated by














Vision of the EUP AH&W


'To provide society with a **sustainable livestock production** sector, where:

- infectious animal diseases are prevented and controlled with appropriate means,
- antimicrobials are used prudently, and
- **animal welfare** is respected in every phase of the production process, until death.'

Due to the close link between animal health, animal welfare and human well-being, the **perspective of One Health and One Welfare** takes a prominent place in the EUP AH&W.

The ambition of EUP AH&W is to build a strong Research and Innovation framework strengthening Europe's capacity to act on a preventive approach and raise healthy animals in sustainable systems, that support high levels of animal welfare

Governance of the EUP AH&W






Main characteristics of the EUP AH&W

- Beneficiaries are: Funding Organisations (FO),
 - Research Performing Organisations (RPO),
 - authorities and European entities (EFSA, EMA)
 - FO bring **cash** for external calls
 - RPO bring **in-kind** contribution
- Activities:
 - Internal programme for RPOs as members of the EUP AH&W
 - **External research calls** for non-member RPOs and private partners Member RPO can take part according to local FO rules
- Co-fund Action: 50% EC-funding overall (cash + in-kind from beneficiaries)



EUP AH&W Timeline

The EUP AH&W should cover a period of 10 years, with the first 7 years foreseen for the initial Grant Agreement



First Internal Projects

56 RPO involved; 17 projects based on 16 Actions from the five priority areas of SRIA

1. Surveillance/monitoring systems and risk assessement for AH&W

- OO1 Action 2. Wildlife network mammals and birds
- OO1 Action 2. Wildlife & disease of aquatic organisms: a European perspective
- OO1 Action 4. Surveillance of AMR in animal pathogens
- OO1 Action 6. Knowledge platform on animal welfare
- OO2 Action 1. Rapid Risk Assessment also aquaculture

2. Procedures, methodologies and tools to analyse AH&W

- OO3 Action 1. Basic knowledge on priority pathogens and infectious diseases also fish and shellfish
- OO3 Action 2. Better tools for the diagnosis of infectious diseases
- OO4 Action 1. Assessment of positive welfare; defining animal-based measures
- OO4 Action 3. Improved assessment of consciousness and death for livestock and fish including crustacean

3. Management on farm, during transport and at slaughter

- OO5 Action 1. Network of experts on biosecurity measures to reduce infections, also on aquatic organisms
- OO5 Action 4. Reinforcement of animal resilience through fundamental research for animal feeding and breeding
- OO6 Action 1. Animal welfare & sustainability including aquaculture & fisheries

4. Treatments and vaccines

- OO7 Action 1. Pathogen-microbiome interactions, immune system & mechanisms of AMR
- OO7 Action 2. New antimicrobial, antiparasitic drugs & tools for assessing their efficacy and safety
- OO8 Action 1. The role of the immune system of food producing animals
- OO8 Action 2. Tools such as vaccine platforms, expression systems, etc.

• OO9 - Action 1. Assess the economic and societal burden of propay diseases




First external Call «Supporting the Future of Animal Health & Welfare»

Includes 30 Funders from 20 countries

 to boost research and facilitate cooperation between all actors

First external Call

Topic 1: Novel Technologies for Prevention, Detection, Assessment, and Management of Animal Health and Welfare







- From genomic surveillance of health and improved disease diagnostic methods to novel or improved vaccines and vaccine platforms
- New technologies aimed at monitoring and improving animal welfare could, for instance, include the creation of sensors, decision support tools, or innovative animal husbandry and aquaculture systems.



First external Call

<u>Topic 2:</u> Fundamental Research for Animal Health and Welfare

Research to advance scientific knowledge and understanding of the biological, immunological, and physiological mechanisms influencing terrestrial and aquatic AH&W.









- Increasing knowledge of priority pathogens (bacteria, parasites, viruses, fungi, or prions responsible for important economic losses or high risk for transmission to humans)
- Interactions with the host microbiome, diagnostics, immunology
- Basis of welfare indicators



First external Call

<u>Topic 3:</u> Animal Health and Welfare and Society

• It covers social, economic, or ethical studies that examine how pathogens, novel technologies or improved animal welfare might impact farmers, fishers, aquaculture producers, consumers, or the

production chain.







• It would also cover studies focusing on human behaviour with respect to biosecurity, perception of welfare and impacts on demand, and communications with farmers and producers to improve acceptability of policy, to facilitate a transition to sustainable production.
